

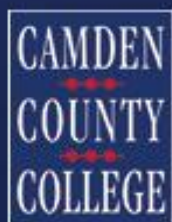

Highest Scholastic Achievement Award

This award is sponsored by Dr. Rica Pineda, Course Coordinator at Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing. Throughout her professional career, she has invested her time educating nursing students and future nurses. Dr. Pineda remains committed to the pursuit of education and to the achievement of academic excellence. This award is given to the student who has achieved the highest academic average in nursing and has demonstrated above average clinical ability.

Vincent T. McDermott, MD Award for Excellence in Medical Nursing

Our Lady of Lourdes Department of Medicine sponsors this award to honor Dr. Vincent T. McDermott, a founding father of Lourdes Hospital. Dr. McDermott was the first Chief of Medicine when the hospital opened in 1950 and held that position until his retirement in 1965. The award is given to the student who has shown excellence in nursing while a nursing student

Sister M. John Francis Coyle, OSF Award for Caring

Sister John Francis was the Dean of Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing from 1964 to 2000. When she retired the faculty wanted to honor her years of service by establishing this award. The award is given to the student whom the faculty feels best represents the values of caring, compassion, commitment, and generosity that Sister John Francis personifies. This student is one who has earned the respect and admiration of patients, families, healthcare team members, faculty, and peers.

Anthony Repici, MD Award for Excellence in Clinical Pediatric Nursing

This award is sponsored by the Department of Pediatrics for clinical excellence in pediatric nursing in honor of Dr. Repici, one of the original pediatricians for Our Lady of Lourdes who was very dedicated to the care of children.

Linda B. Napieralski Award for Extraordinary Dedication to the Profession of Nursing

“Mrs. Nap” was a dedicated and beloved faculty member in the School of Nursing who passed away in 2013. Her dedication to the school was unending and no assignment or task was too small or overwhelming for her to undertake. This award is given to the student demonstrating extraordinary dedication to the profession of nursing.

M. Agnes Berger, RN, Award for Excellence in Perioperative and Surgical Nursing

This award is given to the student who demonstrates excellence in perioperative nursing, which is nursing care delivered, before, during, and after an operation. M. Agnes Berger was hired as a registered nurse in the operating room in 1950 and worked her entire career, over 60 years, there. She held leadership positions in the operating room and was known for her years of teaching and mentoring student and graduate nurses. She retired in 2010 and after her passing in 2013 her Lourdes family wished to honor her work by establishing this award for a graduating student.

Sister M. Elizabeth Corry, OSF Award

A Franciscan woman of faith, vision, courage and grace, Sister M. Elizabeth Corry, OSF, has dedicated her life to serving all of God’s people, with a special emphasis on the poor and underserved. Arriving at Our Lady of Lourdes in 1967 Sister Elizabeth helped guide a small community hospital into a major tertiary care teaching facility. Many of the programs initiated under Sister Elizabeth’s tenure have become the cornerstones of the medical center. Sister Elizabeth embodies the Franciscan ideal of service and hope to the less fortunate. This award is given to the student demonstrating the value of caring by consistent participation in school activities which has contributed to the attainment of school goals

Anthony V. Ziccardi, MD Award for Excellence in Clinical Obstetrical Nursing

This award is sponsored by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology for clinical excellence in obstetric nursing in honor of Dr. Ziccardi. As described by a midwife, it is an honor to help a mother realize that “birth is not only about making babies. It is about making mothers – strong, competent, capable mothers who trust themselves and believe in their inner strength.”

Jordan Middletown Award for Patient Advocacy

The Jordan Middleton Award was developed by the faculty of Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing and is sponsored by Ms. Brenda Hanna, an alumna of the Class of 2000, in memory of her daughter, Jordan. Protecting and enhancing the autonomy of patients by supporting and upholding the patient’s values is profoundly important in health care professions and demonstrates the heart of caring with the nurse profession. The award is given in recognition of the student who has excelled in the area of patient advocacy.

Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing Alumni Award

The philosophy behind this award is to maintain and nurture relationships between classmates and to support the school in its education of student nurses. This award honors the student who exemplifies the role of an educator not only to the patient but their family and fellow students as well.

Kathy Pechulis Memorial Award for Commitment to the Nursing Profession

Mrs. Pechulis graduated with a nursing diploma from Allentown General School of Nursing and returned to school later in life earning her bachelor’s and master’s degree in nursing. “Mrs. P”, as she was fondly called by her students, found passion in teaching and remained dedicated to the nursing and the education of nursing students until her passing in January 2018. This award is given to the student who has shown a commitment to nursing through nurturing and kindness to all.

Alfred D. Sacchetti, MD Award for Nursing Excellence in the Emergency Department

This award honors Dr. Sacchetti, an active and avid supporter of nursing students. The award is given to the student who showing clinical excellence in the emergency department.

Kathy M. Shiveler Award for Excellence in Clinical Nursing

This award was established by Russell Shiveler in memory of his wife, Kathy, who was an ICU nurse at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital for almost 40 years. She was known as a deeply caring advocate for her patients and this scholarship seeks to recognize those qualities of caring and compassion.

The Nursing Leadership Award

This award recognizes a senior nursing student who has demonstrated exceptional leadership qualities, commitment to the nursing profession, and a passion for advancing patient care. This award honors an individual who has shown outstanding initiative in both academic and clinical settings, inspires peers through collaborative efforts, and embodies the values of compassion, integrity, and professionalism. The recipient of this award exemplifies the qualities of a future nursing leader, actively contributing to the improvement of healthcare practices, fostering a positive and supportive environment, and serving as a role model to others in the nursing community.
